

The representative of Plaintiffs shall be allowed to cast their votes separately which shall be kept in a sealed cover. It is also clarified that the result of the elections shall be subject to further orders that may be passed by this Court".

4. On the night between 14.11.2018 and 15.11.2018 an order was displayed in the website of the AICF mentioning the names of the 23 persons who were allowed by the Hon'ble Court to cast their votes.
5. On 16.11.2018 another order was passed by the Hon'ble Court and the para 3 of the order is as follows:- "In view of the above the candidates nominated by the candidates be also allowed to contest the forth coming election. However, as notes earlier all votes cast by the Plaintiffs will be kept in a sealed cover."
6. Consistent with the two orders of the Hon'ble Court a separate compartment was made so as to facilitate the representatives of the plaintiffs to cast their votes separately in a sealed cover. The arrangement was like this that each voter was given one envelope exclusively for putting his ballot papers after putting tick mark and immediately after his envelope was sealed another candidate was called in to exercise vote in a similar way and then all the 23 envelopes were put in one box and sealed.
